 receive communion in both kinds [consecrated
 bread and consecrated wine] through intinction after the parents or guardians of those children
 have met with the priest and given their consent
 for both kinds to be administered.
- All baptized persons, ages 16 and older, whether confirmed or not, may receive communion without permission from others.

HOLY BAPTISM

THE PRESENTATION

BCP, PAGE 273

The minister shall invite the parents and godparents of the children who have been brought for Baptism to come forward using the following or other appropriate words.

MINISTER:

Let all Parents and Godparents who have brought children to be baptized now come forward.

MINISTER:

Why do you present this child for Baptism?

We present this child for Baptism in order that
he/she may be made a living member of the Church
which is the Body of Christ.

MINISTER:

Parents and Godparents, the children whom you have brought for Baptism will, by reason of him/her infancy, depend on your help and encouragement to grow in the knowledge, reverence and service of Almighty God, our Heavenly Father.

You must remember, that it is also your duty to see that he/she is instructed in the good news of God's Salvation in Christ, the Church's Creeds and

Catechism and all other things which a Christian ought to know, believe and practice as a member of the family of God.

As he/she grows up, he/she will also need the help and encouragement of that family, so that he/she learns to be faithful in public worship and private prayer, to live by love and trust in God, and in due course to come to receive the laying on of the hands by the Bishop in Confirmation.

QUESTION:

Will you give that help and encouragement by your prayers, by your example, and by your teaching?

ANSWER: I will do so, the Lord being my helper.

QUESTION:

Will you do all in your power to see that this child is brought to the Bishop to be confirmed?

ANSWER: I will do so, the Lord being my helper.

THE BAPTISMAL VOWS

MINISTER:

Therefore, I ask these questions which you must answer for yourself and for this child whom you have brought for Baptism.

QUESTION:

Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept Him as your Saviour?

ANSWER: I turn and accept Him.

QUESTION:

Do you put your whole trust in His grace and love?

ANSWER: I so put my trust.

QUESTION:

Do you promise to love God and obey Him as your Lord?

ANSWER: I promise.

QUESTION:

Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness?

ANSWER: I do.

QUESTION:

Do you renounce injustice and all the evil powers of the world?

ANSWER: I do.

QUESTION:

Do you reject sin so as to live in the freedom of God's children?

ANSWER: I do.

MINISTER: Let us pray
Heavenly Father, in your love you have called us to
know you, led us to trust you, and united our life with
yours: Surround this child with your love; protect
them from evil; sustain and guide them by your Holy
Spirit, and receive them into the family of your
Church; that he/she may walk with us in the way of
Christ and grow in the knowledge of your love.

THE PROFESSION OF FAITH

BCP, PAGE 277

The Minister says to the Parents and Godparents:

MINISTER:

You have brought this child to Baptism. Will you now declare before God and His Church the Christian Faith into which this child is to be baptized and in which you will help him/her live and grow?

ANSWER: I will.

The Minister says to the congregation:

MINISTER:

My brothers and sisters in Christ, let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our Baptismal commitment.

QUESTION:

Do You Believe in God the Father?

ANSWER:

I believe in God the Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

QUESTION:

Do You Believe in Jesus Christ the Son of God?

ANSWER:

I believe in Jesus Christ His only Son our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again, He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

QUESTION:

Do You Believe in The Holy Spirit?

ANSWER:

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body and the life everlasting.

MINISTER:

This is the faith of the Church.

ALL:

This is our faith. We believe and trust in one God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. (Alleluia! Alleluia!)

THE BAPTISM

MINISTER:
Name this child.
PARENT OR GODPARENT:
N (first name, and middle name(s), if any)
The Minister then baptizes the candidates. He
immerses each child in the water or pours water on
(his/her) head, addressing (him/her) by name.
MINISTER:
N, I baptize you in the name of the Father,
and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
ALL: Amen.

The Minister then makes the sign of the cross saying, and may do so on the forehead with the Holy Chrism saying;

MINISTER:

God has united you to Himself and received you into His family the Church. I sign you with the cross, the sign of Christ. Do not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified. Fight valiantly against all evil and continue Christ's faithful servant to the end of your life.

The Minister or another person may give a lighted candle to the parents or godparents of each child, saying:

MINISTER:

God has rescued us from the power of darkness and brought us into the Kingdom of His beloved Son. Receive this light and walk as a child of light.

ALL:

Let your light so shine that all may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, let us welcome the newly baptized!

ALL:

We welcome you into the Lord's family. We are members together of Christ, children of the same heavenly Father and inheritors together of His kingdom.
